

Radon... This colorless, odorless and tasteless gas has been an item of recent concern to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). In fact, in January 2005, the EPA sought to make the month National Radon Action Month. At this point they stressed the fact that testing for and measurement of this dangerous gas in our indoor air is simple, inexpensive and effective.
